Thirty-three percent (33%) of the world population profess Christianity, but only ten percent are committed to Christ. Latin America has the highest percentage of committed Christians while North America and Pacific have the second highest percentage committed Christians.

Only forty percent (40%) of the world population have contact with Christianity. Sixty percent (60%) do not have any contact with Christianity and have less than 0.1% Christians living in their culture.

There is still a need for more missionaries working in church planting and making disciples.

Persecution of Believers in 2020

- Over 245 million Christians live in environments in which it is not safe to follow Jesus, experiencing high levels of persecution.
4,305 murders of Christians for their faith have been documented in the year 2020.

Another 3,150 Christians are known to have been detained without trial and imprisoned for their faith in 2020.

North Korea has been named as “the most dangerous place in the world to be Christian,” for 18 consecutive years; for each of these 18 years, North Korea has qualified as “extreme” in its persecution of believers. Five years ago, it was the only nation to have earned the “extreme” label; in 2020, there are eleven nations that that were named “extreme,” as a measure of danger for Christians.
